If you are reading this newsletter, you undoubtedly know someone with autism. Most of us know how this story begins. Someone in our own family, a relative, a neighbor,

a friend or a co-worker has a child who is "different" or "delayed". For some of us, this difference was quite profound and noticeable at an early age....no speaking, not interested in the same things as typical children, repetitious, obsessive behaviors, significant problems with eating. Others have children who had noticeable social challenges as the demands of school and peer interaction became increasingly complex. It is all autism.

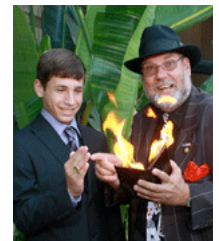

Most campers are assigned a 1:1 camp counselor as needed, although camper to staff ratio during high functioning week is 3:2.

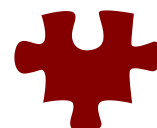
Membership in the San Diego County Chapter of the ASA is not required for enrollment. Camp fees, dates, and registration forms are available on our website: www.sd-autism.org.

Siri Martin Andrews honored as Health Hero

Combined Health Agencies (CHAD) of San Diego presented its annual Hero Health Awards for 2011 on March 16 at The Prado Ballroom in Balboa Park. The heroes being recognized with these awards have given freely of their time, talent, and resources to improve the health and well-being of the people of San Diego County. The Autism Society of San Diego nominated the late Siri Martin Andrews, autism educator, as its Health Hero of 2011. Ms. Andrews, Ph.D, BCBA-D, who recently passed away at the age of 34, after a long battle with cancer, touched the lives of so many through her tireless and dedicated work on behalf of individuals with autism. Ms Andrews' mother, Andrea Martin, and husband, Jason Andrews, accepted her award.



LOCAL MOM STARTS ROCK & ROLL ACADEMY- FINDS SON'S PASSION FOR MUSIC

As a parent of a child on the spectrum, I was always searching for ways for him to practice social skills, be it an art class, a robotics camp, or a gaming course. Frankly, none of them really produced any lasting friendships and he was left alone with no social connection to the world around him. Our quest ended when we tried a week long summer camp that taught him how to play a couple of rock songs on the bass guitar. The week culminated in a loosely structured performance that put a huge smile on our faces. I was astounded at the fact that our son could actually play a song, and not just a couple of notes or chords. It was that act of "playing music with other kids" that made this program so appealing.....even though at age 14, he was taller than most of the 7-15 yr. old kids attending. He didn't seem to notice! I knew that he had found his passion.



That was the beginning of our son's blossoming, both as an individual, and as a musician. He stayed in that "rock music" program for 2 years, until he felt that he had outgrown it. Now, he is 17 and plays in several bands. He is sought after as a bass player because, as with anything he loves, he practices obsessively, writing songs and simply immersing himself in music. He's still quiet and introspective, but he's fulfilled and connected with others. Music has given him joy. It makes him feel that he's truly good at something that matters.

Our son was our inspiration to start our own rock music program in Ocean Beach. It's called Electric Music Studios, and it's located in the back suite of our hair salon, The Electric Chair. We now offer our program to kids and teens, and we are presently working on a program for young adults. For those quiet kids who struggle with communication, and for young adults who have always loved music but have never been able to organize others to start a band, our program does that for them! Our instructors teach them to play, and then put them into a band to play songs together. There is structure, and direction. The students form a camaraderie with one another in a productive safe environment in which to grow musically.

We've kept the program affordable as we want to reach as many people as possible. I feel that this program is so important to kids both off and on the spectrum. It's certainly been a labor of love for my husband Paul, a guitar player, and me and will likely be a lifetime project for our son, who is now an assistant and a member of the EMS Studio Band. We expand in January to add more lesson rooms and an 1800 square foot venue with a stage for our kids to perform!
